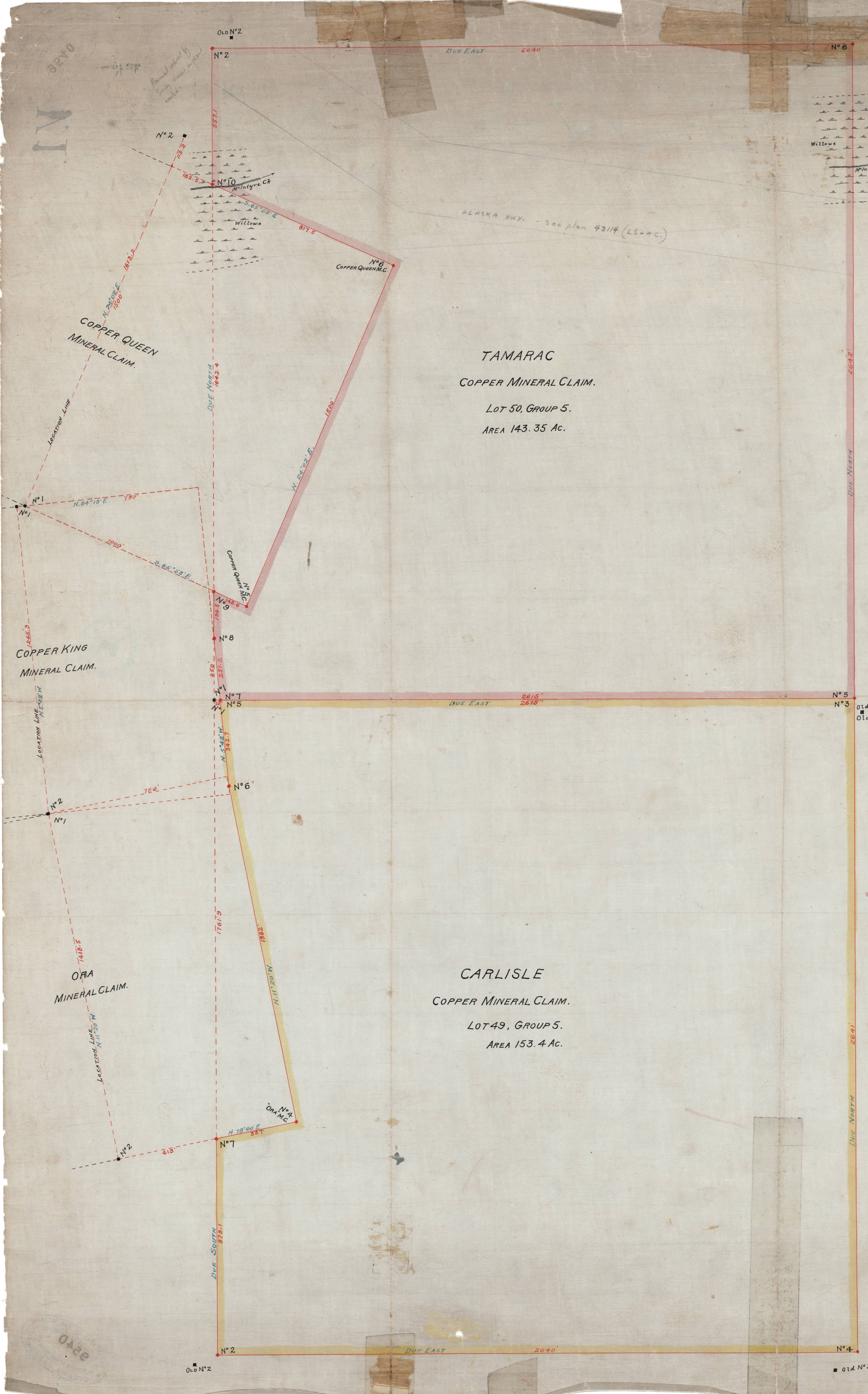




PLAN
